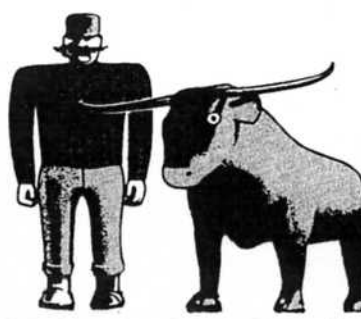
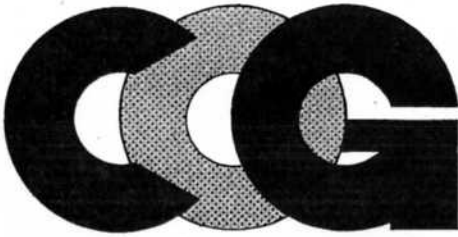

The Rotary emblem was printed on a commemorative stamp for the first time in 1931 at the time of the Vienna Convention.

The First Rotary Club banner (from the Houston Space Center) to orbit the moon was carried by astronaut Frank Borman, a member of that Club.

The First Rotary International Convention held outside the U.S. was in Edinburgh, Scotland in 1921.

The First head of state to address a Rotary Convention was U.S. President Warren G. Harding in St. Louis, 1923.

#### Hair Today, Gone Tomorrow

• On the scalp, each hair grows continuously for 3 to 5 years, then enters a resting phase. After about 3 months of "resting," the hair falls out; a new hair starts growing 3 to 4 months later. Ninety percent of the scalp is always in the growing phase.

• One out of every five men begin balding rapidly in their 20s. Another one out of five will always keep their hair. The others will slowly bald over time.

• The average hair grows half an inch per month, with the fastest growth generally occurring in the morning hours. Hair sprouts fastest of all when you're in love, which many also be due to fluctuations of hormones.

• Eyebrow hairs stay short because their growing phase only lasts for 10 weeks. Eyelashes are replaced every three months.
